
## Ramjiam Sanjia

On a happy note, the show got off to a melodic start with Ram Krishna Dhakal's beautiful songs. It was a perfect set up for the artist Kunti Moktan, whose modern-folk songs lifted audiences off their seats and onto their feet. During the middle of the program, a new singer (also the daughter of Madan Krishna Shrestha), Sarana Shrestha, performed beautiful songs. She mentioned that Portland felt much more like Kathmandu than any other cities they have been on the tour.




## Nepali Gulture Show at Sauvie Island

## Membership Fee

## NAO Sound System

It is with great pleasure that NAO announces the purchase of a sound system worth\$1,100 to enhance the quality of our shows. In the past, NAO has rented such system at a cost of as much as \$400/show. We hope to break even on the investment in about a year. NAO is also exploring the potential to rent the system to various organizations in town in hopes of generating som e income from the investment. The system will also be made available for NAO members at discounted rental prices. The current NAO sound system includes: One 300 Watts rms/channel amplifier, One 22 channel mixer with 24bit Digital Effects processor, two 600 watt rms/1200 watt peak 2 way speakers with two 15 inch woofer and a horn tweeter, two wireless microphones along with necessary cables and two microphone stands with one boom. NAO is much obliged to Dibesh (Dave) Shrestha for volunteering his time to research and order a system with the "the best-bang-for-the-buck" for cash strapped NAO. He has agreed to be the custodian for the system. If you are interested in renting or helping out with the system, please contact Sagar Onta or Dibesh (Dave) Shrestha.




