#### Gham Panni Book


Global Resources Institute (GRI) in Eugene has started a water purification pilot project in Nepal using a method adopted by the World Health Organization. The project is aimed at reducing the drinking water related child mortalities. The method uses the ultraviolet rays of sunlight to purify water. The method was successfully tested in various regions of Nepal, and currently GRI is seeking donors to publish 100,000 copies of a booklet entitled "Gham Paani" describing the purification method.
