himalayan night 2002

Introduction:

Nepali Association of Oregon (NAO) organized a Himalayan Night 2002, a Nepali cultural program event on August 17, 2002 at Portland State University, Portland. The show of its kind featured local Nepali and guest artists from Seattle, Washington. The highlights of the show included Nepali dances (single, duet and group), two live dance/song combinations, including <code>Dusee_re</code> group song/dance, and the instrumental presentations. The program had two presentations from the Nepal Seattle Society—one duet and one group dance. The show represented Hindu and Buddhist devotional dances as well as the modern and rural Nepali ethnic cultures.

A total of twenty-six artists from Portland, Salem, Eugene (Oregon), and seven from Seattle (Washington) participated. About a 90 minutes long program with fourteen items were anchored together by a trio of masters of ceremony, Holly Shakya, Sagar Onta and Sristi Bhattarai.

About 277 people attended the program. Over sixty percent of patrons were Americans. A large contingent of artists and Nepali people came to participate in the program from Seattle.

Promotion and Media Coverage:

The program was heavily promoted through various means. The NAO website had featured the program details as well as the program flyer. The program flyers and posters were distributed and posted in most of public and accessible work places in Portland, Salem, Corvallis and Eugene areas.

The program advertisements were carried by local papers and local radio station (90.4 FM). A promotional article on the Himalayan Night 2002 was published in The Asian Reporter and the Willamette Weekly. The Oregonian also published two small articles promoting the show.

Sponsors and Raffles:

The following sponsors financially supported the Himalayan Night 2002:

The Asian Studies, PSU (Discount in Hall Rental and other services); Gifts From Afar (\$400); Pacific Cost Parts (\$200); Shakti Blue (\$100); Thamel.com (\$100); US West Coast Taekwondo (\$100); Bazaar (\$83); Himalayan Gifts (\$50); Kathmandu Café (\$50).

Altogether, the program raised a total of \$1,083 in sponsorship.

Himalayan Night also received raffle prizes from the following local businesses:

US West Coast Taekwondo (Gift Certificate for three months of Taekwondo lessons worth \$225); REI (a sleeping bag worth \$225); India Place (Gift Certificate for dinner for two worth \$25); Thamel.com (Gift Certificate worth \$50); and Gifts From Afar (Two Gift Certificates worth \$25 each).

The raffle prizes were valued at more than \$575. Raffle prizes were drawn from the paid audiences ticket tabs. The artists and the NAO executive members were excluded from the draw.

The Tazo Tea Company also donated 10 cases (120 bottles) of Bottled Ice Tea.

Promotional Booths/Tables:

Promotional display and sale tables were set up by businesses and organizations including Nepali Association of Oregon, Gifts From Afar, Himalayan Gifts, Potala Imports, Road to Tibet, Association of Nepal, Himalayan Research Bulletin and Eugene/Kathmandu Sister City. Several tables were also setup for cold drinks, chips and candy sale. One table was setup for book display on the Himalayan region.

Snacks and Drinks:

Snacks and Drinks were served to the audience at the interval. NAO collected \$57 from the sale of cold drinks. Volunteers:

About thirty NAO members participated as volunteers to help organize the program.

Budget, Income & Expenditures:

NAO budgeted \$1850 for organizing the program. The actual total expenditures including the snacks were \$2172. That is, NAO spent 17% more than the budgeted amount for the Himalayan Night 2002. The over expenditure in the program was chiefly due to the increased costs of snacks, two additional hours of hall rental for the dress rehearsal on Friday, and printing costs of posters and flyers. In addition, some miscellaneous costs were not budgeted for. The Himalayan Night 2002 made a total revenue of \$4,297 from sponsorships, donations, and ticket and drink sales, with a net income of \$2,293.

Selected Comments from Patrons:

It is the first time Nepali community has done something with this level of success before the largest paying audience. What impressed many in audience was the whole organization of the program, not to mention the smooth flow of the program and captivating performances by the artist group.

The Nepal Seattle Society came as a group of forty member team, including seven artists. We are indebted by their performances and participation. Our special thanks to the president of Nepal Seattle Society, Tirtha Khanal for making this joint venture happen.




